"RISE AND GLORY" HISTORY OF HALARI VISA OSHWALS

When I came to USA I never dreamt that I will write history of our community in English. It took me three years to write the book and two years to get it published.

As far as I know this is the first, though by no means complete, comprehensive history of our community in English written by a member of the Oshwal community. It provides information about our origin and traditions, hardships our ancestors faced and how through their entrepreneurship spirit they overcame them. The book is divided in four parts: Part I, The origin of Oshwal in Rajasthan; Part II, The Migration to Cutchh; Part III, The Migration from Cutchh to Saurastra, and Part IV, Rise and Glory of Halari Oshwals since the beginning of 20th century.

This has been a very rewarding project for me. I am thankful to many people without their help I would not be able to finish the project. I have to thank two special people Jyotsna and Sudhir Shah (my niece and nephew) of California who worked very hard to get this manuscript ready for printing.

With the generous donations from Champa and Velji Bid, Chandaria family, Members of my (Dodhia) family, Madhu and Hemendra Shah, Manisha and Kanti Shah and Debbie and Veni Sumaria we were able to get 3000 copies of the book printed... We are sending the books to our various community organizations: 400 copies to India, 1000 copies to East Africa, 750 copies to England and 200 copies to Canada. These books at our request are to be distributed free of charge to educational institutions, libraries and any interested individuals.

Double occupancy rates are guaranteed based on availability. However, availability and add-on rates for 3rd/4th guests are NOT guaranteed until full deposit is received by Carnival. It is advisable for those guests requiring triples/quads to book as early as possible.

Other cabin categories and single occupancy pricing are available upon request.

REQUIRED DEPOSIT: \$200 per person, which is completely refundable up until June 1

FINAL PAYMENT DUE DATE: June 1

CABIN ASSIGNMENTS

With full deposit, guests booking double occupancy cabins may elect to select either a specific cabin number or book on a "guarantee" basis, which means they are guaranteed that category or better, but the specific cabin number is not assigned immediately. Guarantee bookings are frequently (but not always) upgraded to a higher category for no additional charge. Cabin assignments are generally made about 30 days prior to the cruise.

Guests booking triple/quad occupancy cabins generally must select a specific cabin number to ensure that the proper amounts of beds are available in their cabin.

CANCELLATION PENALTIES

There are no cancellation penalties up until June 1. After June 1, the cruise line's cancellation penalties will apply, ranging from the original deposit amount up to the full cost of the cabin. We do STRONGLY recommend that guests purchase Travel Guard insurance to protect against the risk of unexpected late cancellation due to illness,

accident, family emergency, etc. For most guests, this will cost approximately \$71 per adult and children under the age of 17 are covered for free.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

U.S. citizens are required to provide proof of citizenship, in the form of either a valid passport or BOTH an original birth certificate and government-issued photo ID such as a picture driver's license. Naturalized U.S. citizens may substitute their original naturalization papers in lieu of the birth certificate.

Non-U.S. citizens are required to provide a valid passport and a valid, unexpired U.S. Multiple Re-entry Visa, if applicable.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

We will ensure that the group's overall strict vegetarian dietary requirements are provided for in the main dining room by the cruise line. If individual guests have any other special requirements (additional dietary needs, handicap assistance, birthday/anniversary celebrations, etc.), please let us know and we will be glad to make arrangements directly with the cruise line, within the guidelines of their policies.
