India Fund Raising - Final Update

Last year, on behalf of the Halari Visa Oshwals of America, the Executive Committee had requested donations for three facilities/institutions in India. These are (1) Halari Visa Oshwal Boarding and Kanya Chhatralay, Jamnagar, Gujarat, (2) Oshwal Yatrik Gruh, Palitana, Gujarat and (3) Halari Visa Oshwal Mahajanwadi in Bangalore. This was our first general communitywide fund raising effort and response was exceptionally good. We have received donations totaling \$36,627 ranging from \$51 to \$10,000 from individuals and families. We sincerely would like to thank all those who have donated generously for these worthy needs. We really appreciate your support and kindness. We are really proud of our heritage and we have shown our support to other Oshwals We also would like to thank community volunteers for their time and efforts to help out in fund raising.

We exceeded our total projected goal of \$35,000. We received more monies for (1) Halari Visa Oshwal Boarding and Kanya Chhatralay, Jamnagar, and (2) Oshwal Yatrik Gruh, Palitana than our projections. However, we received minimal for (3) Halari Visa Oshwal Mahajanwadi in Bangalore than our projection of \$5,000. We have transferred \$21,840 to Oshwal Yatrik Gruh in Palitana. Yatrik Gruh trustees were very pleased with our efforts and they have appreciated the contribution from all donors. Trustee Somchandbhai Gosrani has sent email to all donors, thankfully acknowledging contributions and valuable support. Renovation work is already underway. Last year, our president Keshav Shah had called and discussed our plans with a committee member of Oshwal Boarding and Chhatralay for computer systems. His message was conveyed to other members. Since then, they have purchased two sets of computer system for each facility. Our past president Jayanti Galaiya was in India in last December. He met with them and discussed our plan for donating four sets of computer system for each facility. He also observed students using computers. They have welcomed our plans and appreciated our efforts for information technology and higher education for our oshwal students. We will transfer money soon and then they will buy two more sets for each facility. Remaining money will be used for reimbursement of recently purchased computer systems and future training cost and maintenance/repair. We will also transfer \$1,485 to Bangalore Mahajanwadi within few weeks.

We have sent receipts to all donors, indicating your choice and amount for each choice. If we have missed someone or you did not get it, please, let's know and we will be glad to send it again. The following list shows name, city and state of each donor. If we have missed someone or incorrectly shown, please, notify us and we will add or correct it. Keshav Shah is working on Takhtis with Yatrik Gruh and Jamnagar Boarding and Chhatralay. Once again, thank you very much for your contribution in response to our request for fund raising.
